Propelled by the motto: Learning with Innovation, two budding innovators of SPSS Galaxy (Anusha Saxena and Inder Pratap Singh Rajawat of grade 8) have proved their skills by securing 2nd position at MacMillan Budding Scientist Award Competition held at IIT Delhi on 29th Feb. 2020.

The objective of the event was to encourage students to apply scientific acumen to real-life challenges and provide solutions in the form of a model or experimental data.

The team presented the experimental project: Bricks from Non-Biodegradable Plastic Waste with the expert mentorship of Ms. Shilpa Sexana.

The competition was held in two phases, 600 entries were submitted in the first round which was judged by the Team of IIT professors and researchers, and only 10



entries were selected for the final round. The SPSS students impressed the judges by answering all the technical questions.

The team has been awarded a Trophy, Certificate and a Cash Prize of Rs. 20000.
