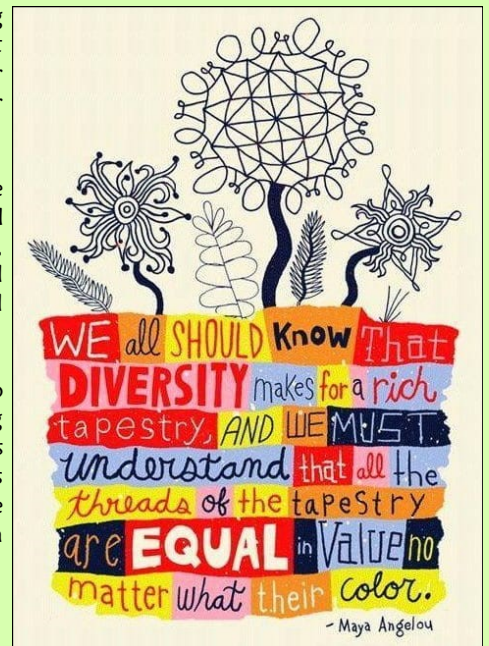

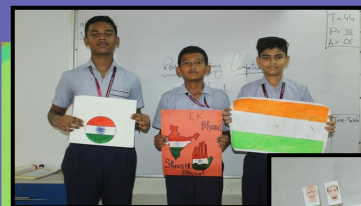


## EK BHARAT, SHRESHTHA BHARAT

Our little chefs participated with full zeal and enthusiasm

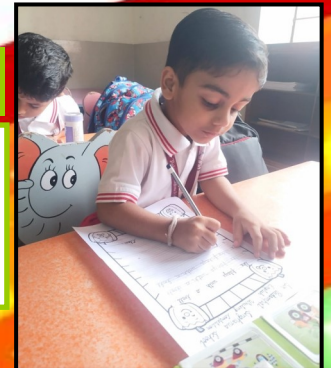
as they doled out nutritious and delectable delicacies.
