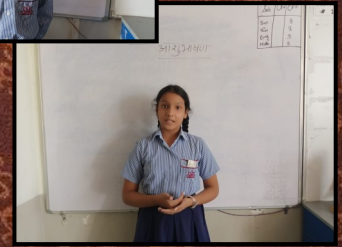
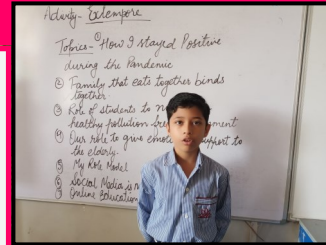


## Extempore

Diwali is a symbol of hope for humankind. May it bring universal compassion, an inner joy of peace, love and the awareness of unity to all.

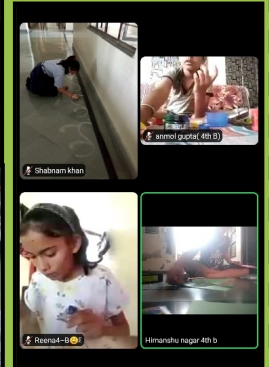
It is time to remove the darkness of ignorance within us & replace it with the light of wisdom.

“The art of writing is the art of discovering what you believe.”

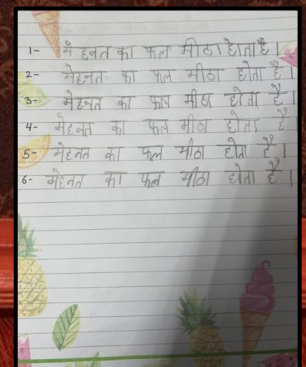
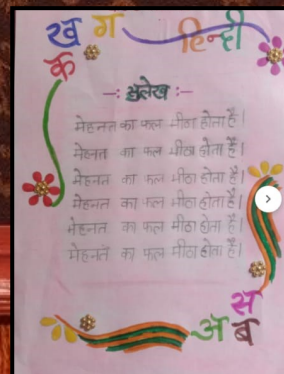
