A parent is a teacher at home and a teacher is a parent in school and the child is the centre of our universe."

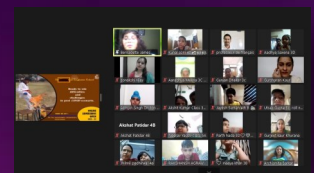
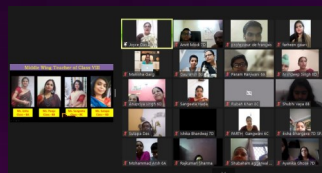
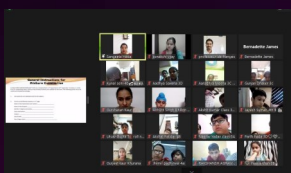

The programme commenced with a warm welcome to the parents followed by enlightening the audience with

the vision of the school.

The session was conducted by the Coordinator, Ms. Joyce Das along with the middle wing teachers. Parents were addressed by showing a comprehensive PowerPoint Presentation. 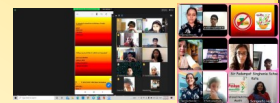
It is actually our responsibility to know the earth and keep it green....

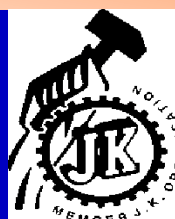
